2. On what dates and times was it shown in each school?
3. Who in the School District previewed the video?
4. Who in the School District approved the video for showing?
5. What was the reason for showing the video in the School District? What was the purpose?
6. Who wrote, produced, and made the video? Who was responsible for its content?
7. Who paid for the video?
8. Who provided it to the School District?
9. How did the video come to be shown in the School District? Did the School District request it from the provider? Did the provider contact the School District and request that it be approved and shown?
10. To which classes and age groups was it shown?
11. Was viewing mandatory or optional?
12. Were parents told in advance the video was going to be shown?
13. Were parents invited to come and view it with the students? Were parents given the option of withdrawing their child from the viewing?
14. Will this video be shown again? If so, on what dates and in which schools?

1. The video was shown only in some Lake City High School classrooms. It was optional.
2. The video was shown on Friday, February 18th at 9:15am.
3. Dan Armstrong, multimedia teacher, previewed the video.
4. Dan Armstrong, multimedia teacher, approved the video for showing.
5. Students went out into the community to look for current events. They chose the park because they thought it was interesting. The purpose was to share information on the regular televised announcements.
6. Students wrote, produced and made the video. Dan Armstrong, multimedia teacher, was responsible for the content.
7. There was no purchase of a video.
8. Lake City High School students produced the video.
9. Lake City High School students produced the video. The school district did not request it it was produced by students. The provider was Lake City High School.
10. The video was shown to Lake City High School students in grades ranging from 9-12.
11. Viewing was optional.
12. Parents were not informed that the video was being shown, beyond the normal notice that our multimedia class shows a student-produced informational video once a month.
13. Other than the normal announcements, parents were not invited to view the video nor have students opt out of viewing the video.
14. This video will not be shown again.
